### Action

1     Apologies for absence

Apologies were received from:

2     Minutes of the last meeting

These were approved without amendment

3     Eydon Olympics de-brief

The Olympics made over £500 net of costs.

The change to an earlier date appeared not to have had a great impact, positive or negative.

It was noted that the winners' medals ran out during the afternoon and some winners had to make do with stickers.

There was a discussion about whether an entry fee should be charged but eventually it was agreed that the current system of paying per event worked fine.

4     Treasurer's post

Barry reported that he had discussed with John Grindlay the principle of him stepping down as treasurer. It was agreed that Angus would approach JG to understand whether he wished to step down now as Barry had found a replacement in Peter Keenan who was prepared to take on the role.

Subject to JG's confirmation, it was agreed that PK would be elected as treasurer and that the committee would record their gratitude for all that JG had done for the sports field.

5 John Grindlay's Tractor

John Grindlay's tractor has unfortunately seized as a result of damage to a water pipe. This raises an immediate issue about the current cutting of the outfield but discussion also broadened out to consider the future options for this if the Cricket Club becomes dormant

Broadly, the options discussed were:

- Hope that JG will be happy to continue to mow the field
- Seek to find someone else, e.g. Joe Stamper who may be prepared to cut the field
- Pay the Council or other contractor to mow the field
- Buy a tractor to pull the existing gang mower

Although no firm conclusion was reached, it was noted that the health of the cricket club had a bearing on the size of the maintenance burden that the committee would need to deal with.

6 Cricket nets

Barry reported that the Cricket Club had confirmed in principle that it was prepared to contribute to the replacement of the netting round the cricket nets. The cost of the materials would be likely to be around £200 and this should be done in time for next spring.

In the meantime the working party will mow/strim around the nest and spray the weeds.
