

Access Statement – Eydon Village Hall

Approach

The postcode is NN11 3PP and the grid ref. 45442504.

There is limited public transport at Woodford Halse, Culworth, and Byfield, all 2-3 miles away. The nearest railway station is Banbury (10 miles).

Roads into the village are from Canon's Ashby (M1/A5 approach); Culworth; Woodford Halse and Byfield (all Banbury approach) and Preston Capes.

The Hall is almost halfway along the High Street (on the east side), at the junction with Doctors Lane.

Arrival

Visitors can be dropped off – there is a dropped kerb access on to the level, gravelled pavement 20m from the main entrance. In addition there are some steps with handrail. Parking is in the street or elsewhere in the village; there is no car park. There is a streetlight on the corner of the building and a light, operated by an external switch, over the double entrance doors which open manually. The entrance hallway is 50mm lower than the pavement and is fitted with a sloped wedge.

Inside

The Hall is all on one level. It is lit by fluorescent strip lighting. The inner entrance double doors are part glazed and operate manually. There is a unisex wheelchair accessible toilet off the entrance hallway. There is a loop system with portable microphone, let us know of your requirements. Access into the kitchen is not possible by wheelchair but the counter hatch can be lifted for serving. The walls and internal doors (except the brown wall divider door) are all currently off-white and sanitary ware white, but all rooms have a different floor colour and/or texture.

Means of Escape

The fire exit route is back through the main entrance. There are two further exits which both have external steps and would need assistance as required.
